10 01 51 00 **Damien**: We're coming from Australia

10 01 53 00 Jane: We're brother and sister

10 01 54 00 **Quentin** : Oh nice, it's great.

10 01 57 00 **Damien**: Yeah, yeah, same parents.

10 01 59 00 Quentin: And you like working together?

10 02 02 00 **Damien**: Yes, sometimes.

10 02 04 00 **Quentin**: Why did you decide to come to Prague?

10 02 06 00 **Jane**: I came because I new friends from here and it's just kind of liveable and I went back to Australia and Damien said like, "I'm coming" yeah.
